From the Manager's Desk

Updates on various projects and Township news from August 2018 to November 2018

The Board appointed Josephine Dick to the Water and Sewer Authority for a term expiring December 31, 2022.

The Board approved ordinance 2018-2, establishing the regulation of fireworks within the Township.

The Board approved the following resolutions:

- Resolution 2018-13, opposing statewide earned income tax collection by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- Resolution 2018-14, to promote sustainability through its municipal policies and practices and affirms its participation in the Sustainable Pennsylvania Community Certification program.
- Resolution 2018-15, establishing the legal fees for Stock & Leader for 2019.

The Board approved, with conditions, the Fair Valley Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan, located at 2549 S. George Street.

The Board approved a special encroachment permit with the right to proceed with the extension as a private road for Fair Valley, located at 2549 S. George Street.

The Board re-approved, with conditions, the Spry Church Reverse Subdivision Plan, located at 50 School Street.

The York Township Fire Company's non-emergency activities list for workers compensation coverage was approved.

The Board agreed to increase the Police Protective Units (PPU's) by 4 to a total of 99 for police service from York Area Regional Police.

A Memorandum of Understanding between York Township and York County Planning Commission (YCPC) for the Congestion Management Process (CMP) Timing Project was approved.

A proposal to conduct a sanitary sewer maintenance building concept study was approved.

The Board approved to extend a pilot agreement to the Baptist Convention of Pennsylvania South and exonerate any outstanding tax liability due to the Township.

Approved expending funds not to exceed \$120,000 to complete the design and permitting tasks necessary to phase out the Spangler Meadows Pump Station.

Four scholarships were awarded for continuing education to members and youth of the volunteer firefighters of the Township.

A recessed meeting was held to discuss the activities of the Stormwater Consortium, YCPC's initiative to create a Stormwater Authority, the update to the County's Water Implementation Plan and the Township's efforts to revise our Stormwater Ordinance.

The Township received a new Schwarze A9 regenerative air street sweeper.

We need your help!

York Township Commissioners are considering developing a new York Township Community Center. Prior to any decision, the Township Commissioners seek feedback from York Township residents. To assist with capturing residents' input, the services of Lepson Research Group, a local research firm, have been obtained.

A mail survey will or has recently been forwarded to each York Township residence. We ask that you take a few minutes to complete the survey and return it in the included self-addressed, postage paid envelope. If desired, you will be able to complete the survey online. **Your time and input will be much appreciated.**

Township Expenses to rise significantly due to Public Safety

The cost to provide public safety (police, fire and ambulance) has steadily increased. The costs per year from 2016 to 2018 were respectively: \$5,209,962, \$5,314,970 and \$5,436,456. The 2019 costs will increase by \$447,000 or by 10.5% for police service due to increases in operating costs and an increased need for service due to more crimes, more traffic issues and more calls for service. Additionally, 2019 costs will increase by 3.9% for fire protection services due to increased costs of insurance to provide workers compensation insurance to our volunteers and a general increase in the Township's contribution for fire and ambulance services. This brings the Township's 2019 budget for public safety (police, fire and ambulance) to \$5,929,160 or 50% of the Township's general fund expenses.

To help cover these required additional expenses to provide for public safety, the Board of Commissioners approved a .18 mil increase for a general millage real estate tax increase and .03 mil increase in the fire tax for 2019. A home assessed at \$100,000 will pay \$124.00 in general purpose real estate tax and \$37.00 in fire protection tax. There will be no increase in the sewer rates for 2019. From the Tax Collector's Desk

I wish you a happy 2019! Hopefully we don't have a terrible winter this year. If you have not received your 2019 County/Township Tax Bill by the end of February 2019, please contact the office by either e-mail or phone at k.crumling@yorktownship.com or 717-741-0056. If you plan on being away the beginning of February or you have moved and still own the property, please contact the office by phone or e-mail for instructions on where you would like your tax bill sent. The office will have the Property Tax Rebate forms and School Rebate forms by the beginning of March. If you are over 65, over 50 and a widow/widower, or you are disabled, you may qualify for the Property Tax Rebates from the State and School. Feel free to contact me and I will help you determine if you qualify.

If you are applying for the Homestead Exclusion, all paperwork must be sent to the York County Assessment Office by 3/1/19 so you can get the credit on the 2019/20 School Taxes. If you have the Homestead already, you don't need to fill out the paperwork unless you move to another property address.

If you receive an Interim Bill for a newly built home, deck, pool, or any other construction that required a building permit, please read the letter enclosed with the bills. The letter will give you information about office hours, what the bill is for and how to handle the bill if you have an escrow. I have also included inserts in the County/Township Bill and School Bills that will give you the

office hours and days that the office is open. If you come during hours that the office is closed, the Township has an outside drop box that you can put your payment in if paying with a check. Please no cash in the drop box.

If you have delinquent taxes from prior years, you will need to contact the York County Tax Claim Bureau for payment information. The York County Tax Claim Bureau's phone number is 717-771-9205.

If you are coming in to get copies of previous year taxes, please contact the office before coming in for the copies. We can e-mail or fax these copies to your Tax Preparer or you. E-mail me at k.crumling@yorktownship.com.

Office hours between 1/2/19-2/15/19 are Monday & Thursday from 8:00 am – 2:30 pm. Office hours between 2/18/19-4/18/19 are Monday – Thursday from 8:00 am – 4:30 pm. Ordinance Review – Chapter 199: Snow and Ice Removal Please keep the following requirements in mind when clearing snow and ice from public sidewalks and/or near fire hydrants on your property this winter:

Every person in charge or in control of any building or lot of land fronting or abutting on a paved sidewalk, whether as owner, tenant, occupant, lessee or otherwise, shall remove and clear away or cause to be removed or cleared away snow and/or ice from a path of at least 30 inches in width from so much of said sidewalk as is in front of or abuts on said building or lot of land.

A. Except as provided in Subsection B hereof, snow and ice shall

be removed from sidewalks within 12 hours after the cessation of any fall of snow, sleet or freezing rain.



B. In the event that snow and/or ice on a sidewalk has become so hard that it cannot be removed without likelihood of damage to the sidewalk, the person charged with its removal shall, within the time mentioned in Subsection A hereof, cause enough sand or other abrasive to be put on the sidewalk to make travel reasonably safe and shall, as soon thereafter as weather permits, cause to be cleared a path in said sidewalk of at least 30 inches in width.

No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited any snow or ice on or immediately next to a fire hydrant or on any sidewalk, roadway or loading and unloading areas of a public transportation system.

Please keep in mind that a property owner's responsibility for sidewalk also extends to making necessary repairs, regardless of who originally built the sidewalk.

WINTER MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES

All Township roads are divided into 18 sections or routes. An operator, with pre-determined equipment, is assigned to one of these 18 routes. The majority of the time this is the standard deployment, however depending on the conditions, we may only deploy 6 operators to treat the snow emergency roads or what is designated as the priority routes. Snow emergency roads are posted with signs and are designated as such due to factors of high traffic volume, steep grades, and areas with limited access or close proximity to the Schools, Police, Fire and Medical Facilities.

Prior to the storm you may notice the pretreating of certain priority roads with liquid brine. The brine is a specific concentration (23.3 %) of sodium chloride that lowers the freezing point of water. Although we would like to pre-treat all of the Township roads, it's just not possible due to time and equipment availability. When appropriate we plan to pretreat all of the snow emergency routes with liquid brine.

SNOW EMERGENCIES

On rare occasions a snow emergency will be declared. The initial focus will be on the priority (snow emergency posted) roads. The snow emergency declaration will be broadcast on the local radio and television stations and will be posted on the York Township website. Again, all snow emergency streets are identified with signage. After the snow emergency is declared, it shall be unlawful at any time during the continuance of the emergency for any person:

- To park a motor vehicle or to allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency routes designated; or
- To operate a motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route in such a manner or in such a reasonable condition as to allow or permit such vehicle to become stalled on such route, either by reason of the fact that the driving wheels of such vehicle are not equipped with tire chains or effective tires or by reason of the fact that the motor fuel supply of such vehicle has been allowed to become exhausted.

Please be aware that failure to abide by the above is a violation of a Township ordinance and may result in fines and/or towing costs. For a complete listing of the streets and a full text of the ordinance please visit the Township website.



STATE ROADS

Many roads within York Township are owned and maintained by PennDOT. State roads include: Interstate 83, Cape Horn Road/Winterstown Road, South Queen Street, East Prospect Road, Leader Heights Road/Indian Rock Dam Road, South Pleasant Avenue (from Dallastown Boro to Hess Farm Road), Springwood Road, Camp Betty Washington Road, Lombard Road – Yoe, Country Club Road, Hess Farm Road (Township line to Iron Stone Hill and South Pleasant to Township line), South Duke Street - Dallastown, Horn Road/South Franklin Street (from South Duke to Horn Road), South Park Street, Iron Stone Hill Road, South George Street/ Susquehanna Trail, Starcross Road/Old Baltimore Pike, Reynolds Mill Road, Brillhart Station Road, Hollywood Drive, Days Mill Road/ Croll School, Tyler Run Road, Water Street (off Reynolds Mill Road) and Grantley Road. PennDOT has their own policies and procedures for winter maintenance. Please contact the local PennDOT maintenance office at 717-848-6230 for assistance.

MAILBOXES AND DRIVEWAYS

York Township DOES NOT compensate property owners should their mailbox, or any other object, become damaged due to the removal of snow from Township roads. Any object placed in the road right-of-way, including a mailbox, fence, landscaping, etc. is at the owner's risk. The public right of way is on average 50 feet wide (25 feet from the center of the roadway). Mailbox damage usually happens from the weight of the snow. Make sure your mailbox is sturdy and secure prior to winter.

It is suggested that you wait until after all plowing is complete before shoveling out the end of your driveway. If you do shovel out before the plows have come through, try to clear a spot upstream of your driveway. This will allow the snow from the plow to unload before the driveway. It won't prevent all snow from going back in front of your driveway but it will reduce the amount. The snow must be plowed from the street, therefore all driveways and properties will be affected to some degree.

CONCLUSION

It takes many hours to reach all township roads safely. The 80 plus cul–de–sacs and several hundred intersections makes it even more time consuming. Please be patient. Each and every storm is different, however the only constant is our response. You can find links to plow routes and maps throughout the Township by visiting the public works area on the York Township website.

STREET CLEANING

Street cleaning usually begins after winter maintenance completely ends. It is a continuous process that does not stop until all Township roads have been cleaned. York Township is not responsible for cleaning of state roads, therefore the Township will not clean them.

JUST A REMINDER

Just a friendly reminder to the property owners in York Township. It is your responsibility to keep your trees, shrubbery, mailboxes, etc. from protruding past the curb into the street area. There are many maintenance activities that must occur close to the curb

(snow plowing, street sweeping, street paving, trash collection, etc.) which can be impacted by these obstructions. Overgrown trees and shrubbery can also impact the sight distance for the motoring public. Refer to Ordinance # 2014-5 found on the Township website for more details.

STORMWATER NEWS

STORMWATER BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES FOR WINTER MAINTENANCE

Snow and ice on roads, parking lots, driveways, and sidewalks can create hazardous conditions for people and property. Snow and ice removal are best done non-chemically with plows and shovels, but the results are not always adequate to ensure safety. Chemical ice melters and/or sanding is often part of a comprehensive strategy to make winter's passage a safe one, but how do they affect water quality of our local waterways?

Salt and sand have traditionally been perceived as the cheapest and most effective materials for de-icing driving and walking surfaces. However, many people do not realize that they have hidden impacts that can detract from their overall effectiveness.




Even in small quantities, salt can:



Deplete the oxygen supply needed by aquatic animals and plants; and,


Leach into the ground and change soil composition, making it hard for plants to survive.

Similarly, sand can:



Lose its effectiveness after becoming embedded in snow and ice; and,

Enter catch basins, storm drains, and surface waters if it is not swept up each spring.



Below is a list of best management practices for effective winter

Salt Application: Follow manufacturer's instructions and use only enough to break the ice/pavement bond. Do not apply on vegetation or near waterways. Use less harmful deicers such as Calcium Magnesium Acetate or Sodium/Potassium Acetate.

Sand Application: Use only enough to provide traction on slippery areas. Sweep up excess sand after snowmelt.

Snow & Ice Disposal: Do not dispose of snow and ice in wetlands, creeks, or other waterways or directly on top of storm drains.

In an effort to protect our waterways, York Township produces and utilizes salt brine, a solution of salt and water, before inclement weather as an anti-icing or pre-treating procedure; as well as after weather events while applying rock salt. Salt brine reduces the adhesion of snow and ice to road surfaces, reducing the total amount of rock salt being used.

Following these best management practices will help prevent degradation of water quality in York Township's waterways, so please do your part to protect our streams from unnecessary stormwater pollution!

RECYCLING & TRASH INFO



BRUSH RECYCLING

Brush is defined as tree limbs, shrubbery, leaves and the like (no grass) no larger than 8 inches in diameter and 6 feet in length. York Township accepts brush from York Township residents only as part of our recycling efforts. Brush recycling is intended to clean up small amounts of debris from residential properties. The program is not intended to accept large tree removal projects. Large projects, such as removing entire trees, should employ the services of a commercial contractor. If you have large amounts of material to dispose, please contact York Township first for approval.

In addition, we suspect non Township residents are illegally dropping brush at the Township site. In response to this, we may require proof of residency or begin to limit the disposal open times.

The drop off site is located at the Township Municipal Building beyond the gate between the two signs. Please enter from Oak Road. Do not enter from Coventry Road for this is a restricted area for Township employees only.

The site will be open for self-serve (unassisted) use for 4 consecutive days in the months of December, January and February. It starts the first full weekend of the month beginning on the first Friday and closing on the following Monday. Daily hours are dawn to dusk. See specific dates below.

- January 4, 2019 through January 7, 2019
- February 1, 2019 through February 4, 2019
- December 6, 2019 through December 9, 2019

During the months of March through November, the drop off site will be open for self-serve (unassisted) for 18 consecutive days beginning on the first Friday of the month and closing three Mondays later. Daily hours are dawn to dusk. See specific dates below.

- March 1, 2019 through March 18, 2019.
- April 5, 2019 through April 22, 2019
- May 3, 2019 through May 20, 2019
- June 7, 2019 through June 24, 2019
- July 3, 2019 through July 22, 2019
- August 2, 2019 through August 19, 2019
- September 6, 2019 through September 23, 2019
- October 4, 2019 through October 21, 2019
- November 1, 2019 through November 18, 2019

We ask that you participate in this program responsibly by not dumping unlawful items at the site. Examples are garbage, metals, concrete, lumber, stumps, stones, grass clippings, etc.

All other material and items you see beyond the gate are for Township use only and are not meant for the general public to use or take. If you see a violation, please report it to the Township or York Area Regional Police Department. The site is under constant video surveillance.

Public Works will process the brush into mulch which is currently made available to Township residents free of charge on a first come first serve basis. The mulch pile is located in front of the gate (left side). Even though the gate may be OPEN, **DO NOT Drive past the gate when the site is closed** as indicated by the red sign on the left gate AND THE ELECTRONIC SIGN BOARD. Mulch may not be available at all times. The mulch availability and the times and dates of brush recycling are subject to change at Township discretion.

<u>Newspaper</u> – clean and dry, no food contact <u>Cardboard</u> – dry and flattened, no food contact

<u>Cartons</u> – milk, juice, soup, wine, broth, cream, egg substitutes

CANNOT BE INCLUDED:

Soiled Materials – dirty diapers, wet cardboard, food waste, food-soiled materials, used paper towels or tissues

Hazardous Materials & Medical Waste – all solvent, oil, chemical containers, propane tanks, pool chemicals, *batteries, and NEEDLES Electronic Waste – computers, computer accessories, televisions, monitors, and e-readers

<u>Packing Materials</u> – styrofoam, packing peanuts, shredded paper, and bubble wrap

<u>Lights & Glassware</u> – light bulbs, strings of lights, drinking glasses, broken glass and mirrors

Paper & Paperboard – newspaper inserts, magazines, catalogs/brochures, envelopes & junk mail, food boxes (i.e. cereal & Jello), pizza boxes, paper towel & toilet paper rolls, office paper (any color), tissue boxes, phone books, and other soft cover books Miscellaneous – plastic tableware, Tupperware, **plastic bags, plastic food wrappers, aluminum foil, scrap metal, can lids, clothing hangers, hoses, windows, and ceramics

- * Household (alkaline) batteries can be placed in the trash. Rechargeable batteries can be recycled at select retailers.
- ** Plastic bags should be recycled at grocery stores and department stores, including Walmart, Target, etc.

CURBSIDE YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Please follow these guidelines when placing yard waste for collection: Place curbside by **6:00 am** on the designated Saturdays. The hauler starts promptly at 6:00 am and quickly moves through the township as they do not need to stop at every residence.

Yard waste includes material such as tree trimmings, shrubbery and other organic landscape vegetation no larger than 8" in diameter. Yard waste DOES NOT include: grass clippings, weeds, fruit and vegetable scraps, tree stumps, dirt and stones, or any trash or recyclable materials.

Prepare for collection: Place yard waste in biodegradable brown craft bags or bundle with biodegradable twine in bundles no longer than 4 feet in length, not weighing more than 50 pounds. You may also use the round blue 32 gallon recycle bins or similar 32 gallon can without a lid. The yard waste must be visible to the hauler.

Yard waste in plastic bags or mobile carts will not be collected on the designated Saturday yard waste collection days.

RESIDENTIAL ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

The York County Solid Waste Authority's Residential Electronics Recycling Program is free and open to York County residents ONLY and is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to noon at the Small Load Drop-off Facility at the York County Resource Recovery Center, 2651 Blackbridge Road, York, PA 17406.

- Any infectious or biological waste.

WASTE OIL COLLECTION

Waste oil may be dropped off at the Public Works Service
Building Monday – Friday from 7:30 am – 3:00 pm.
Please do not drop off oil after hours. Waste oil must not be contaminated with any non-combustible liquids such as water and anti-freeze.



RESIDENTIAL TRASH COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Residential trash and recycling collection begins at 6:00 am on your collection day. All refuse and recycling containers and any larger (bulk) item shall be placed curbside no earlier than 5:00 pm on the evening preceding the day scheduled for collection and shall be removed no later than 12:00 midnight in the evening when collection occurs.

Important guidelines to keep in mind for residential trash collection services are as follows:

On April 10, 2018 the York Township Board of Commissioners awarded the residential trash collection contract to Penn Waste for the next four years. The quarterly fees for basic service of (3) 32-gallon bags or cans of trash, unlimited recycling with cart, one large item per week, 12 times per year curbside yard waste collection and a Township administration fee of \$1.50 are as follows:

July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019 = \$48.00 per quarter July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020 = \$49.38 per quarter July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021 = \$50.82 per quarter July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022 = \$52.35 per quarter

The optional 96-gallon mobile trash cart rental fee will be:

July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019 = \$11.50 per quarter July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020 = \$11.80 per quarter July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021 = \$12.20 per quarter July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022 = \$12.55 per quarter

The price for extra service bags will remain at \$4.00 each from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2020 and will increase to \$4.50 for July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2022.

Large (Bulk) Items: If your waste collection falls under the Township residential contract (directly billed by Penn Waste), you are entitled to place one large (bulk) item out per week with your regular trash and recycling. You only need to contact Penn Waste in advance if the item contains refrigerant (i.e. refrigerator, dehumidifier, air conditioner). Bulk items are those which cannot be disposed in the regular trash container and can be lifted by two people (i.e. sofa, mattress, carpet, etc.). Residents who pay for waste collection as part of their rent or condo/homeowners fee must contact their landlord or association for the rules regarding bulk items per their commercial contract.

Round Recycling Bins: Are the property of York Township, not the contracted hauler. The bins should remain with the property if sold. The bins are partially funded through a State recycling grant. If you never received a 32-gallon bin and you are billed directly by Penn Waste, you may pick one up at the Township offices. If your bin is cracked or broken, you must bring it to the Township office to obtain another bin. Additional bins may be purchased for a fee of \$7.50. Recycling bin stickers are available free-of-charge for those who wish to provide their own smaller bin for recycling.

If you are not directly billed by Penn Waste and your refuse service is provided through your landlord, condo association, or homeowner's association, you must contact the landlord or association to get a recycling bin through your refuse hauler.

Recyclables must be placed in a separate bin from trash and are picked up on your regular trash day. Replacement bins are available at the Township Administrative Office or the Public Works Department.





RECYCLING & TRASH INFO



NATIONWIDE RECYCLING CRISIS

Unfortunately, due to the "hopeful recycling" many citizens have done in the past, our recyclables have been contaminated with items that DO NOT belong in the recycling stream (garden hoses, scrap metal, plastic toys, disposable diapers). The excessive contamination has caused China, the world's largest consumer of recycled materials, to reject most recyclables from the United States. New recycling guidelines have been set forth to encourage residents "back to the basics" in order to clean up the recycling stream. The two major changes are:

- 1) Plastics #1, #2, & #5 only, bottles & jugs, narrower neck than the sides of the bottle
- 2) Newspaper/Cardboard clean, dry and flattened newspaper and cardboard only, NO food contact

Cans, glass and cartons are still acceptable items for recycling. All items should be clean, caps removed.

Please help our recycling center achieve a clean and pure recycling stream that can be marketed and eventually used to produce new items.

"When in doubt - throw it out!"

YARD/WOODY WASTE

Township residents are encouraged to recycle their yard/ woody waste by either the curbside collection or at the Township drop off facility. Material such as tree and shrubbery trimmings and other organic landscape vegetation no larger than 8" in diameter is accepted. In no instance should anything other than the aforementioned items be placed in the brown Kraft bags for collection or drop off. NO grass, weeds, dirt, stones, fruit & vegetable scraps, trash or recyclables are acceptable. The Township has been experiencing some of these items "hidden" in the bottom of the Kraft bags which causes damage to the equipment used to process the yard/ woody waste into mulch.

COMMERCIAL RECYCLING IS REQUIRED BY LAW

Pennsylvania State Act 101 of 1988 and York Township Ordinance 2006-12 require nonresidential establishments to recycle. Nonresidential establishments include all commercial, municipal, institutional, and community groups that do not fit into a residential category. To comply with the State and Local laws, you are required to recycle the following items:

- Aluminum
- Steel and bimetallic cans
- High-Grade Office Paper
 Leaf waste
- Corrugated Paper (cardboard)
- Glass (clear, brown and green)



TRASH AND RECYCLING ETIQUETTE

- · Please be kind to your neighbors and do not place your trash and recycling curbside until 5:00 pm the night prior to collection and have the containers removed by midnight the day of collection. Not only is this being a good neighbor, it's the **LAW!** York Township Ordinances 204-3 and 204-4, subsection D, specify this requirement.
- If you are included in the Penn Waste residential contract, you are only allowed to place three (3) 32-gallon trash bags/cans OR your mobile cart filled with the lid closed, unlimited recycling and one (1) large item per week.
- Residents are not allowed to place large quantities of trash in excess of these guidelines as Penn Waste is not obligated to collect the excess. Should you need additional trash services, you can purchase extra service bags for \$4.00 each at the Township office. These orange, 32-gallon bags allow you to place additional bags curbside.
- In the situation where you may be cleaning out a property and do not wish to rent a roll-off container, you can take advantage of the small load drop-off at York County Resource Recovery Center (YCRRC) for a small fee. York County residents may transport waste by car, truck or trailer to the YCRRC. Electronics recycling is also conducted at this location.

Monday through Friday from 8:00 am until 4:00 pm, Saturday from 8:00 am until noon. The "per ton" cost to dispose of waste is \$62 per ton. The minimum fee to dispose of waste is \$20 (up to 640 pounds). From 640 pounds the cost is assessed proportionately. For example, the cost to dispose of 1/2 ton of waste is \$31.00.

Any resident who has trash service provided as part of their homeowners/condo association fee or rent will need to check with their association or landlord for their trash limit guidelines.

SMOKE ALARMS SAVE LIVES


Having a properly installed smoke alarm in your home is the best thing you can do to save your life and your family's life in the event of a fire. Here are some installation tips from the U.S. Fire Administration and the NFPA:

- Install a smoke alarm on every floor of your home, even the basement.
- Install a smoke alarm outside of every sleeping area. Ideally, install smoke alarms in every sleeping area too.
- Install the alarm on the ceiling or on a wall near the ceiling.
- Test them once a month. If they have batteries, replace twice a year or buy a ten-year-life battery.
- Smoke alarms don't last forever. Replace smoke alarms every ten years.

York Regional Emergency Medical Services Inc. (formerly Yoe Ambulance Service) has been serving from Yoe Fire Company since 1972 and from Goodwill Fire Co since 2004. We serve a primary population of 40,000+ people residing in four municipalities: Yoe Borough, Dallastown Borough, Windsor Township and York Township. We provide 24-hour a day transport capable of Advanced Life Support (ALS) ambulance service from each station. Peak-hour units are staffed from 6:00 am to 6:00 pm, week-days, in order to enhance the level of service provided during this high demand period.

York Regional Emergency Medical Services Inc. is a non-profit, 501(c)3, charitable organization incorporated in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. We are licensed by the Pennsylvania Department of Health and are dispatched by the York County Department of Emergency Services - 911 Center.

The 2019 Annual Subscription requests will be mailed March 1st. While many Subscriptions expire at different times during the year, the bulk of our Subscribers are on an annual cycle for each Spring. Unfortunately, this amount is usually far below our cost to provide 24-hour a day emergency ambulance service to a population of 40,000+ citizens. Any portion of the fees not covered by private insurance becomes an out-of-pocket expense for the patient.

As a York Regional EMS Subscriber, we will only bill Primary and Secondary Insurance providers. Payment from a subscriber's insurance carrier will satisfy your obligation to us for our service costs*. Non-Subscribers are responsible for payment in full for services, regardless of the amount covered by their insurance carrier. Subscribers shall forward any payments received directly from their insurance carrier to York Regional EMS immediately upon receipt.

The demand for emergency medical services has grown dramatically over the past several years. If we are already committed to an emergency when you need us, the 911 center will dispatch the next closest available ambulance service. PARTICIPATION AND REGISTRATION GUIDELINES

- **REGISTRATION FORMS for various programs** will be placed online at <u>www.yorktownshiprec.com</u> as they become available. Forms for some programs may also be picked up at the YTRec Office.
- ADVANCE PAYMENT is required for all programs as it will ensure a space in the class/program. Checks may be made payable to York Township.
- PARTICIPATION in any class/program/event constitutes permission to use likeness in promotional materials.
- THE DEPARTMENT is NOT responsible for injuries while participating in any of its activities.
- **REFUNDS** will not be granted after the start of a class except in the case of injury or illness. Written documentation from a physician will be required. No refunds for Bus Trips will be given when spots are cancelled less than 30 days before trip unless the trip is cancelled by the Township or unless you find a replacement for your seat.
- PROGRAM SIZE is limited and will be filled on a first come, first serve basis. Classes/events reaching capacity will start a wait list.
- PROGRAM DATES & TIMES are contingent on availability of facilities and are subject to change.
- **PROGRAMS** postponed or not held by the instructor due to emergencies will be made up by the instructor or fees will be prorated. Classes missed by the participant will not be made up.
- **POLICY ON CHILDREN**—Participants are not permitted to bring children with them to class. Enrollment age is included with the description of most of the classes.
- **CANCELLATIONS**—In case of inclement weather, we may cancel our programs. Remember, if the Dallastown Area School District cancels classes, then our activities are cancelled also. PARK RULES / HOURS

- 1. ALL Parks are closed between dusk and dawn, with the exception of York Township Park. York Township Park is closed between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am. No trespassing during these hours or when area is otherwise closed by the Township.
- 2. No littering.
- 3. No negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property.
- 4. NO GOLFING IN PARKS. Outdoor recreation activity is restricted to locations appropriate to the activity or as directed.
- 5. Open fires or hot coals must be in fireplaces or grills. Fires may not be left unattended and must be thoroughly extinguished before they are abandoned.
- 6. No solicitation.
- 7. No alcoholic beverages or drugs. No one permitted in the area under the influence of alcoholic beverages or drugs.
- 8. Use of explosives, fireworks, guns, rifles, air guns, bows, slingshots, or similar items is prohibited.
- **9.** Injuring or killing wild animals is prohibited.
- 10. Boisterous, immoral or indecent conduct is prohibited.
- 11. No facilities may be reserved without completion of an application form and approval of the Recreation Director of the Township.
- 12. Dogs must be kept on a leash or otherwise tied. All canine solid waste must be removed from the park.
- **13.** Motor vehicles may be driven and parked only in designated areas.
- 14. No inflatables, pony rides, petting zoos, game trucks, etc. allowed with pavilion/building rentals.
